

15 July, 1944: Charitable Issue with Premiums for the Benefit of the Govt. General's "Cultural Fund" (really, with the aim of destroying Polish Culture and replacing it with German). Five stamps designed by W.Dachauer and engraved by F.Lorber. Printed recess by the Govt. Printing Works, Vienna, on medium, white paper. No watermark. Perf. 14. Sheets in 2 panes of 10 x 5.



12+18 Gr deep green:  
Konrad Celtis (pseudonym  
for K.Pickel, 1459-1508)  
German but Polonised hu-  
manist, poet and mathema-  
tician, founder of the  
first Polish Literary Society "Sodalitas Litteraria Vistulana".



24+26 Gr red-carmine:  
Andreas Schlüter (abt.  
1660-1714, Gdańsk)  
sculptor and architect  
practising in Warsaw.



30+30 Gr blackish lilac:  
Jan Boner (1463-1523),  
merchant, banker for Ro-  
yalty, polonised country  
squire of Alsatian birth.



50+50 Gr violet-ultra-  
marine: August II "The  
Strong" (1670-1733),  
Saxon elector and King  
of Poland from 1697.



1 Zl + 1 Zl reddish  
brown: Jerzy Bogumił  
Pusch (1791-1846),  
as his name shows,  
a Polish geologist.

In use until the end of the German occupation.

15 July, 1944: Charitable Issue with Premium for the Benefit of the Govt.,  
General's "Cultural Fund, contd.



Post Card with pre-printed 12(Gr) Hitler Gen.Govt, with extra postage 30(Gr)  
Mi.79 Hitler, and Mi.120-123, all cancelled by special postmark "FUNK JAHR  
GENERALGOVERNEMENT", 26.10.1944 / KRAKAU", and mailed from Kraków to Neu-  
brandenburg.

26 Oct. 1944: 5th Anniversary of the Government-General. Issued with premium: one stamp designed by P. Stübinger and engraved by R. Zenziger. Printed by Govt. Printing Works, Vienna, on medium, white paper. No watermark. Perf. 14½. Sheets in 2 panes of 2 x 4 stamps each, cut into separate sheetlets. Exist in slightly varying colour shades (see following pages).

Cancelled To Order  
at Krakau 1 P.O. on  
First Day of Issue.

Note: This stamp was printed in three impressions. In fact only the first was put into circulation, the second was distributed for commercial purposes and the third (colour variety deep red and greyish black) remained unfinished (without perforation and gumming, although gumming was finally partly completed).

The first impression was in use until the end of the German occupation, very soon after issue.
