Note: All stamps shown are Perf. $12\frac{1}{2}$, and it appears that there is little or no variation in the perforations of this printing. Also the Pelure Paper quality is very homogeneous. The only notable difference seems to be in colour shades. The stamps shown have been arranged in dark-to-light order.
